

## Fire Door Checklist

Please use the summary and tick-box checklist below to help you ensure your fire doors are in good working order and will be effective in the event of a fire

- 1. Is the door a fire door? If in doubt check with your supervisor. It is good practice to number the fire doors to assist in record keeping.
- Open the door halfway and let it close: it should latch automatically. If the door doesn't latch, you may need to adjust the door closer.
- 3. Ensure the smoke seals are in place and aren't worn out or covered over (paint etc).
- Check for damage to the fire door: dents, holes etc anything that will impact on the integrity of the fire door
- The three hinges should be secure (all screws in place!) and in good condition.
- Gaps around the fire door should be less than 4mm on the top and sides, and less than 8mm between the bottom of the door and the floor.
- Check you have the correct signage on the door in most cases signs will be needed on both sides of the door.
- Make sure there are no obstructions near the fire door.
